

Year 6 Summer Term Curriculum Map (First Half)



MATHS

Children will be learning to solve problems using 1 step and 2 equations before moving onto looking into statistics and understanding how to analyse pie charts, line graphs.

Key vocabulary: problems, integer, pie chart, percentage, fraction, x and y axis, average

ENGLISH

This term, the children will be writing and producing a podcast of our own duel narrative. **Key Vocabulary:** semi-colon, colon, passive & active voice, subjunctive form, relative clauses and hyphens.

SCIENCE

This term the children will begin their work on electricity, understanding how electric circuits work, building on their knowledge and understanding from Year 4. They will then move on to light. Key Vocabulary: Circuit, complete circuit, circuit diagram, circuit symbol, cell, battery, bulb, reflect, reflective, dark/darkness, direction

HISTORY/GEOGRAPHY

Children will bring together all previous Geography learning and research, utilising prior knowledge, an aspect of climate change important to them e.g. Australia Wildfire, Antarctica, Flooding in Britain and/or other natural disasters.

Key vocabulary: climate change, human features, physical features, equator, pollution, time zone.

MUSIC

Children will study music from around the world (Scotland, Brazil and India). They will learn key features including drone, raga and samba music and compose a simple melody using the notes of a pentatonic scale. Key Vocabulary: drone, raga, samba, composing and pentatonic scale.

PΕ

Children will be continuing to look at athletics (running, jumping and throwing). They will develop their skills in throwing and catching accurately and how to run efficiently. **Key vocabulary:** spring, false-starts, longdistance, pulse-raiser, accuracy, distance.

COMPUTING

Children will use a computer to produce 3D models, moving, resizing and duplicating objects. They will create hollow objects using placeholders and combine multiple objects to create a model of a desk tidy. **Key** Vocabulary: 3D, perspective, work-plane, duplicate, dimension.

RE
