

Broom Leys Primary School Report to Parents:
The P.E. and Sport Premium 2021 / 2022 – Funding Report

July 2022



At Broom Leys School our aim is for all pupils to lead healthy and active lifestyles and to develop a lifelong love of sport and physical exercise. We welcome the additional funding being made available to primary schools and are keen to allocate the funding appropriately to achieve our goals.

What is it?

The P.E. and Sport Premium is government money designed to help develop the quality of physical education and sport in primary schools. The funding is allocated to schools for children from Reception to Year 6. In 2020/21 the funding allocated to schools was £16,000 per school plus £10 per child. Schools must have a focus on increasing physical activity as well as Physical Education and Sport.

How much P.E. and Sport Premium money does our school get?

For the 2021 - 22 school year the school received £21,000

Enhancement of the PE Curriculum through gymnastics coaching	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gymnastics is a weaker area in our provision, an area which teachers do not feel confident in delivering. By employing a gymnastics coach, children received better training and teachers had the opportunity to observe a specialist coach, in order to improve their own delivery.
Additional Swimming sessions (above the core offer) for those who cannot yet swim 25 metres	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Having carried out an evaluation of our swimming provision it was clear that too many children are still leaving primary school unable to swim 25 metres (the national curriculum minimum standard). In order to improve this additional swimming lessons were provided for children who are unable to swim. Costs included pool hire, staff training and coach hire.
