



MATHS

Children will add and subtract numbers within 100. They will add/subtract one to and from a 2 digit number. They will find ten more and ten less than a number and investigate multiplication.

Key Vocabulary: add, subtract, multiplication.

HISTORY

Children will discuss the concept of remembrance and why/how we remember victims of the war. They will learn about why a poppy is a symbol of remembrance.

Key Vocabulary: Remembrance, war, memorial, poppy, soldier.

COMPUTING

Children will capture photographs and will gain experience capturing, editing, and improving photos. they will use this knowledge to recognise that images they see may not be real.

Key Vocabulary: device, capture, image.

ENGLISH

Children will read a range of alternative traditional tales and then write a retelling, an alternative ending to a tale and a letter.

Key Vocabulary: alternative, characters, plot.

DT

Children will plan, create and evaluate a Christmas stocking. They will select and use a range of tools to shape and join materials.

Key Vocabulary: design, evaluate, tools, join, sewing, stitch

MUSIC

Children will explore how sounds can communicate atmosphere and help to tell a story. They will compose music to accompany the telling of a story. They will also learn about orchestral instruments.

Key Vocabulary: orchestral, instruments, story.

RE

Children will be learning why Christmas is important to Christians. They will recognise traditions and rituals for celebrating Christmas.

Key Vocabulary: Jesus, God, Christmas, advent, celebration.

SCIENCE

Children will identify things that are living, dead or have never been alive. They will identify how animals and plants are suited to their habitats and how the habitats provide their basic needs.

Key Vocabulary: living, dead, habitat.

PE

Children will work together in teams to develop their team building skills through a range of different activities.

Key Vocabulary: agility, skills, team, perseverance.

PSHE / RSE

Children will learn about rules, rights and responsibilities and why they are important. They will have a chance to reflect on their responsibilities.

Key Vocabulary: rules, rights, responsibilities.
